



Grant Management System

GMS was developed several years ago by REJIS for the Missouri Highway Safety Division to support their effort to manage a large volume of grant applications. These programs are spread over many program areas which in turn can be supported by one of several funding sources. GMS is designed to support the program management cycle activities throughout the budget year. Submitting agencies, as well as the administrating agency, benefit through online access to appropriate information during the annual process.

The REJIS Commission is a local government agency created to "serve the public interest through delivering quality, cost-effective technology services to the justice community and to government and quasi-government agencies." REJIS' primary focus is to provide record management services to law enforcement, courts, and corrections agencies at the local, state and federal levels. This includes interfaces to the Missouri State Highway Patrol's MULES system, the National Crime Information Center (NCIC), and the NLETS network. REJIS was founded in 1975 under a cooperative agreement between St. Louis County and the City of St. Louis. Our customers are primarily concentrated in the metropolitan St. Louis and southwestern Illinois areas.

REJIS services include:

- Development of custom applications
- Installation and support of custom and commercially available software
- Custom interfaces
- IT Support Service
- Data center outsourcing
- Network, training and help desk support.

REJIS has approximately 140 employees located at three sites. Most of the staff and equipment are based at the REJIS building, in the Central West End of St. Louis.

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Benefits and Features

Program application process: A combination of static and configurable application information requirements allows the addition of grant programs without enhancements to the application. This information, captured in conjunction with optional predefined program question responses, helps determine which submitters are awarded grant funds.

Permission based agency/contact management: Program oriented permissions, defined by the administering agency, controls access to data within GMS. They also support defining programs available to client agencies. These controls can be fine tuned for contact permissions within an agency.

Funding Source to contract associations: A key feature supporting the contract award process is reconciling approved applications dollars to funding source dollars available. This reconciliation is expedited in GMS to a significant degree.

Applicant Support – With GMS, grantee agencies have the ability to submit applications on-line. They also have access to the following information on-line:

- Historical reference to applications and approved contracts
- Program instructions and other documentation
- Online vouchering and disbursement detail
- Insight into program permissions for their agency

“Enforcement Activity” data capture: To show benefit for funds previously received, participating agencies can be asked to provide feedback via GMS on specific criteria.

Administrative Support: Given grantee access to information online, the administrating agency realizes a significant reduction in the time spent supporting their clients.

Reporting: Reports for program contract monitoring, year end assessment and efficacy analysis are provided to support grant management evaluation processes.
